# **School Mission and Community**

#### **Our Mission**

Martin Luther School embodies Christ's love for a diverse community, where our students are encouraged to grow in faith and flourish in academics, the arts, athletics, and life.

### **Our Community**

Martin Luther is a parochial, Lutheran co-education middle and high school founded in 1960 that serves the greater NYC area. The student body reflects the ethnic diversity of the city. With easy access to New York City, students have access to many resources outside the walls of the school.

# **College Credits**

Students may earn as many as 19 credits toward their college education during their time at Martin Luther School. Classes are offered through our college partners: Concordia University - Nebraska and St. John's University. Popular course options include: General Biology, Human Anatomy, Introduction to Sport Management, and Calculus.

#### **Graduation Requirements**

In order to receive a high school diploma from Martin Luther School, a student must:

- Complete 24.5 credits
- Complete 32 hours of community service
- Pass 5 basic New York State Regents Exams

Students are permitted to take a maximum of eight credits per year. Half credit classes meet every other day for a full school year or everyday for one semester. All Martin Luther students must complete one half unit of Leadership & Faith Formation and one half unit of Physical Education (PE) each year a student is in attendance.

Once students complete the required courses within a subject, they are encouraged to take more challenging courses in that subject to prepare themselves for college and further their education.
